A.S.H.R.A.E. members should be prepared to vote FOR or AGAINST the center at the next meeting.


NOMINATION COMMITTEE

BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING

March 18, 1965

Chuck passed out a form letter from the National, listing items of information they need to know about our Chapter at the National.
